Although no statistics exist on the subject, it is clear that computer law is one of the fastest growing legal fields. Since 1960, when the first, generally speculative articles began to appear in the literature, the volume of material being published on one or another aspect of the subject has increased exponentially. Today, there is a virtual avalanche of articles, books and government publications on the legal implications of computers. These materials appear in a wide range of forums, from such specialized periodicals as the *Jurimetrics Journal*, to such popular fare as *Time* magazine and the *New Yorker*.

In 1978, there were over 1200 items published on the subject worldwide. The following bibliography organizes them topically according to the following index.
